### **Course Description including any prerequisites or other requirements:**

This class welcomes all skill levels, including those brand new to sewing. Students will learn about the tools required, the parts of the sewing machines, different projects and the best fabrics to use for each, and how to print and cut out patterns. Students will also create a variety of projects made from woven fabrics.

While we will start with the basics, students with intermediate sewing skills will find the class to be beneficial...we all can use a refresher on the basics from time-to-time!

### **Student Responsibilities and Expectations**

- 1) Students must follow all safety guidelines (they will receive a copy on the first day of class).
- Students must be willing to listen, follow directions, and NOT move ahead of the teacher/helper instructions. We will work on projects step-by-step. This allows students to learn from each other as well as learn to solve problems together, as they arise.
- 3) After the introductory lessons on patterns, students will be REQUIRED to cut out the patterns and projects at home and bring them to class. This will allow more time to be spent on advancing the students' skills at the sewing machine.

#### **Grading Breakdown**

Students' projects will be assessed at their completion. The teacher will send home a form with a breakdown of the skills learned and the level to which the individual student was able to implement each skill.

At the end of the semester, the teacher will give the students a written quiz on vocabulary, sewing skills, etc. (It will be matching, fill-in-the-blank, and multiple choice.)

## **Textbooks and Supplies Required**

- 1) The teacher will provide all print outs, textbooks, etc. for additional learning.
- 2) The teacher can provide up to 8 sewing machines for the classroom setting. Students are encouraged to bring in their own sewing machines (TOP-LOADING bobbin only—ask me if you are unsure about this.)
- 3) Each student will need to bring in the following supplies:
  - a) Fabric for projects
  - b) Thread for projects
  - c) Pins or sewing clips
- These materials will be provided in class. However, students will want these to work on at home projects:
  - a) Fabric cutting scissors
  - b) Snips
  - c) Seam rippers
  - d) Universal sewing machine needles
